I really like working on a team with social workers, psychologists, occupational therapists, physical therapists, the [general education] teachers. It's really nice to get more holistic scope of the student and to see that student through the lens of different professionals. I think that it allows me to provide the best quality therapy that I can.

Chris Dowd: My favorite part of being a speech language pathologist in an educational setting is probably the Early Childhood Program here at Lenawee Intermediate School District. I love going into the homes working with the parents. I love working with infants on feeding skills. I love working with really birth to age five. Any communication devices, just seeing children learn and grow at that age is my happy place; my happy place is with young children and I feel the Lenawee Intermediate School District really puts emphasis on early childhood.

a lot of documentation billing, there's meetings with the staff that we go to talk about student progress and areas of need that they may have.
